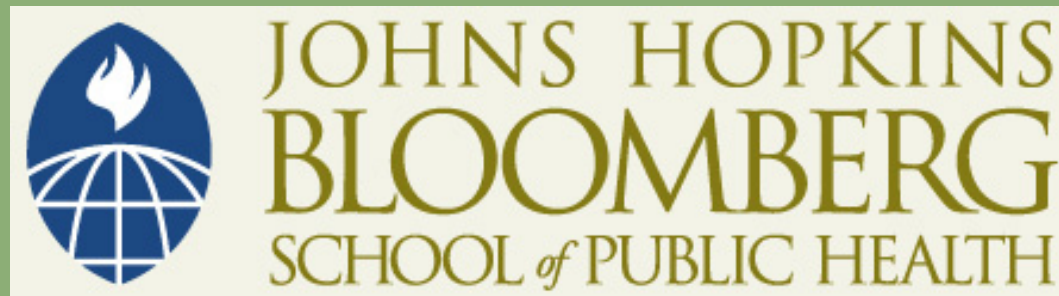

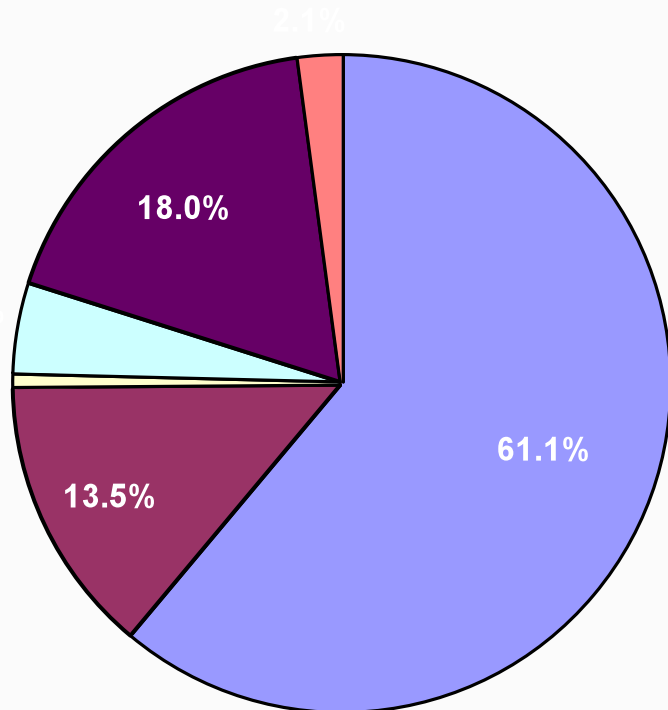
Youth in the United States, 2006

- In the United States, youth 15–24 years of age represent **13.9%** of the population

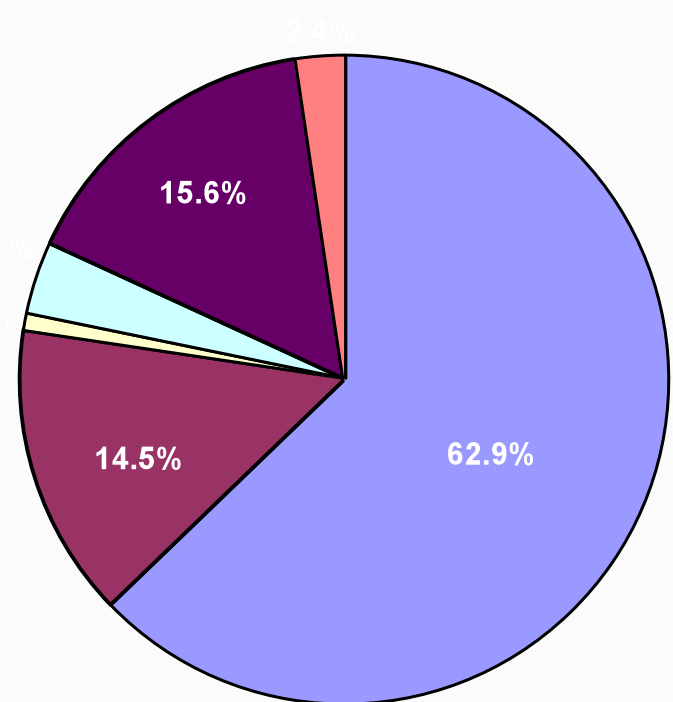
Race/Ethnicity: Young Adults, Adolescents, 2000

Young Adults (20–24)

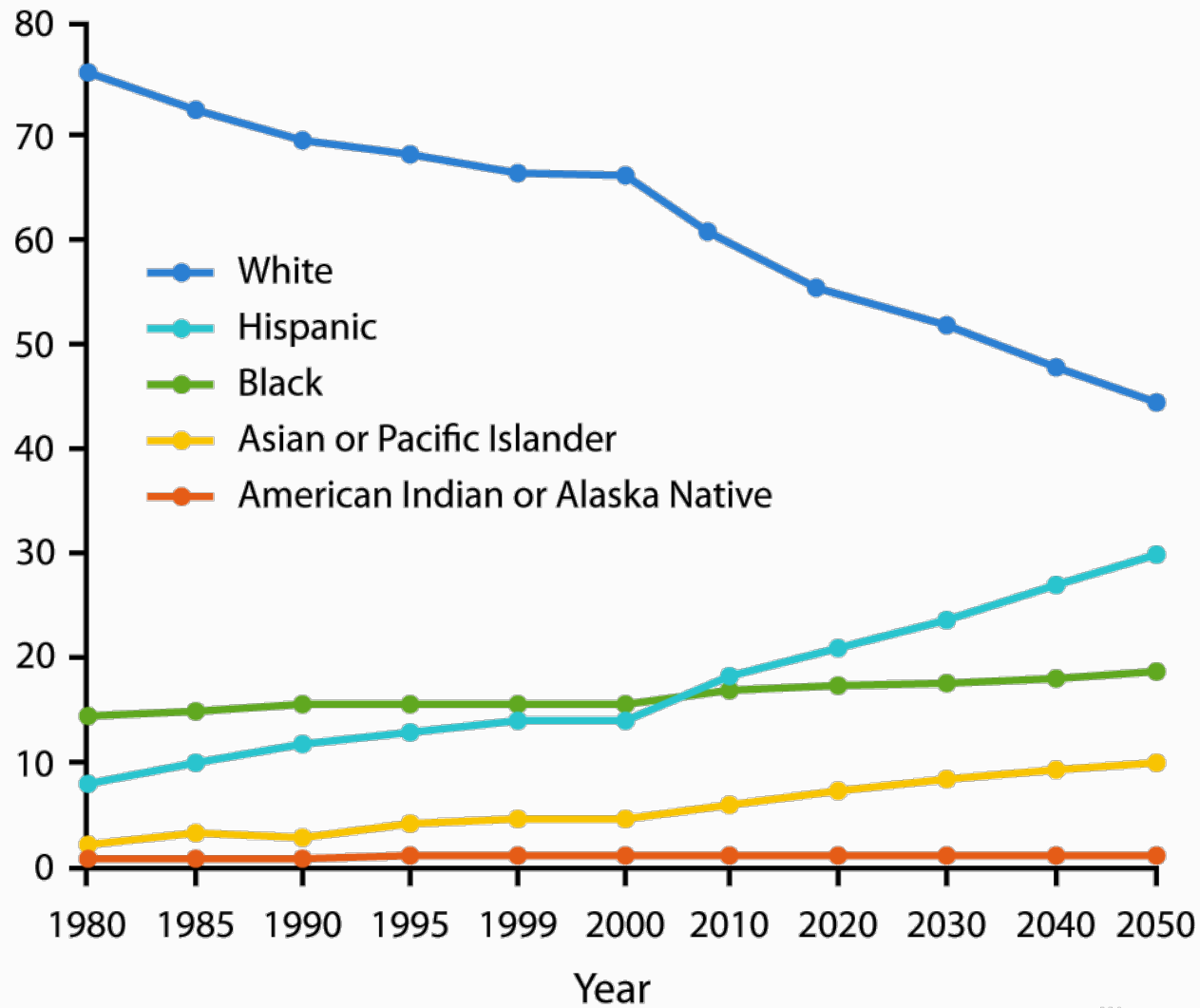


Adolescents (10–19)
