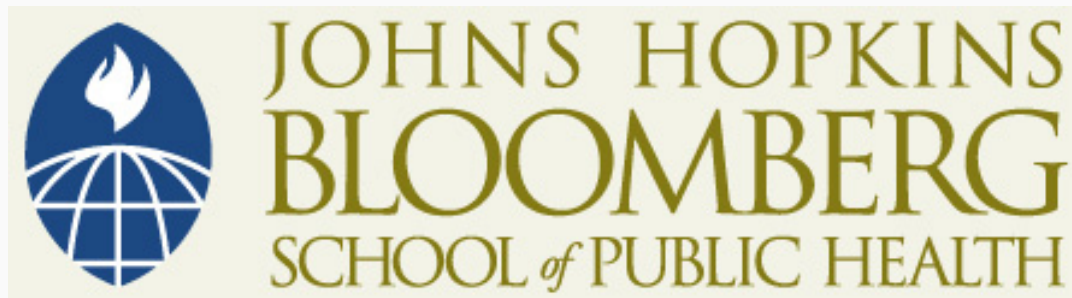


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Global Nutrition Transition

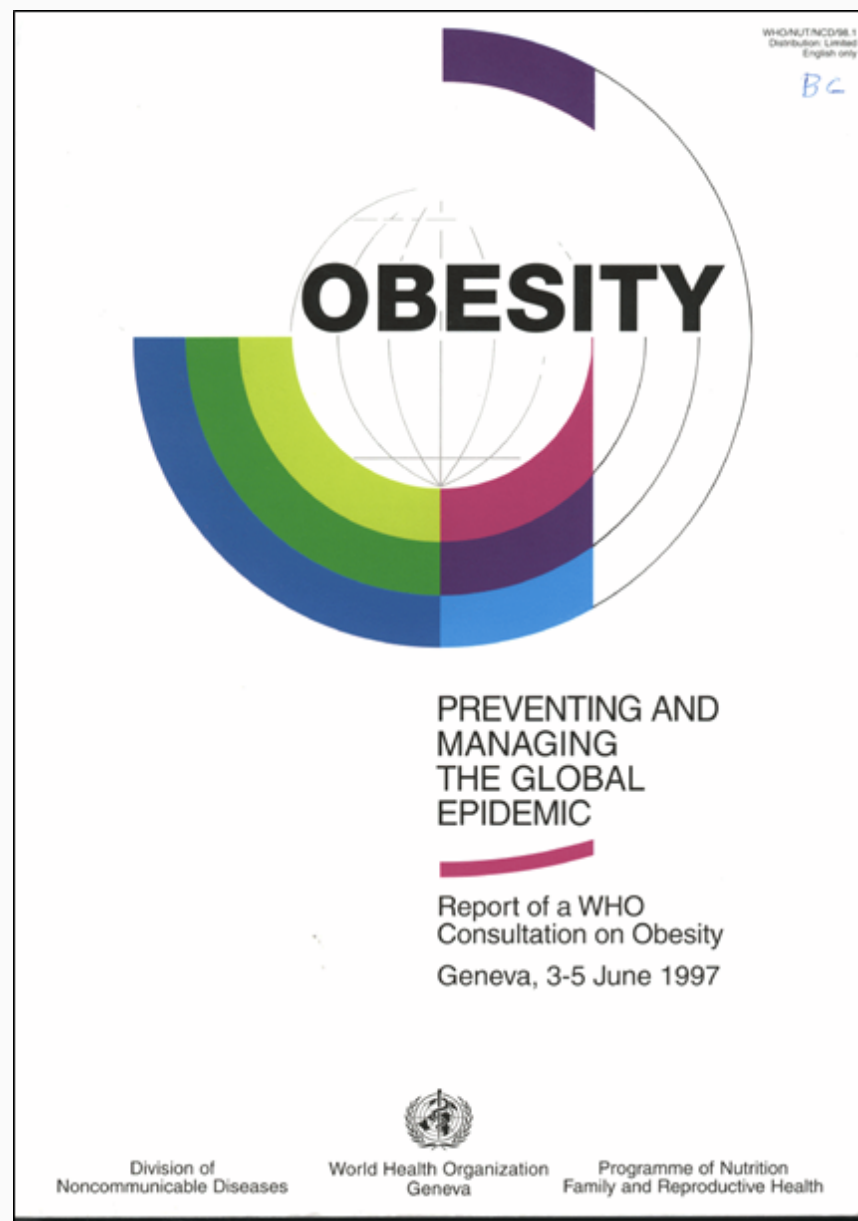

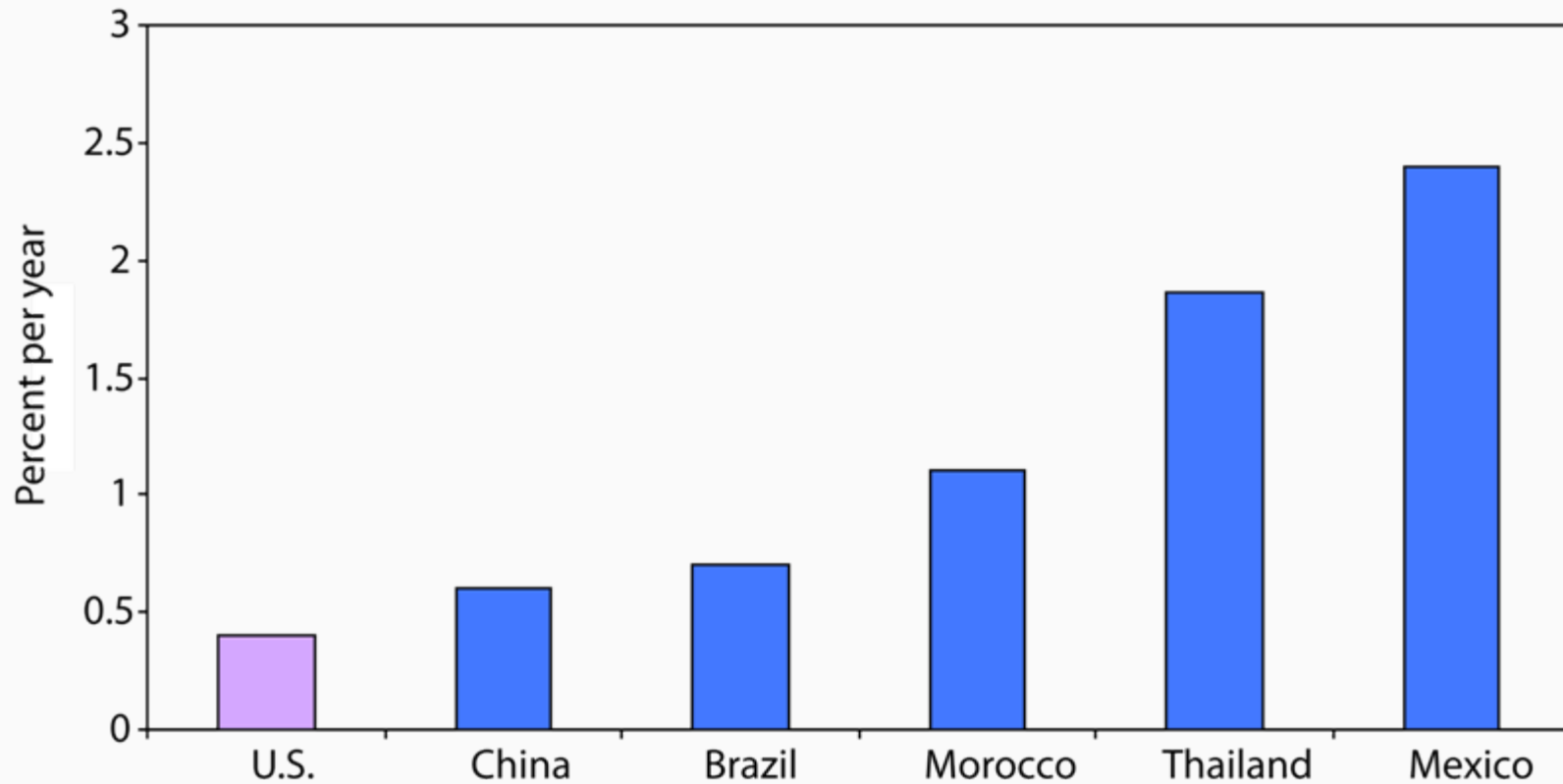

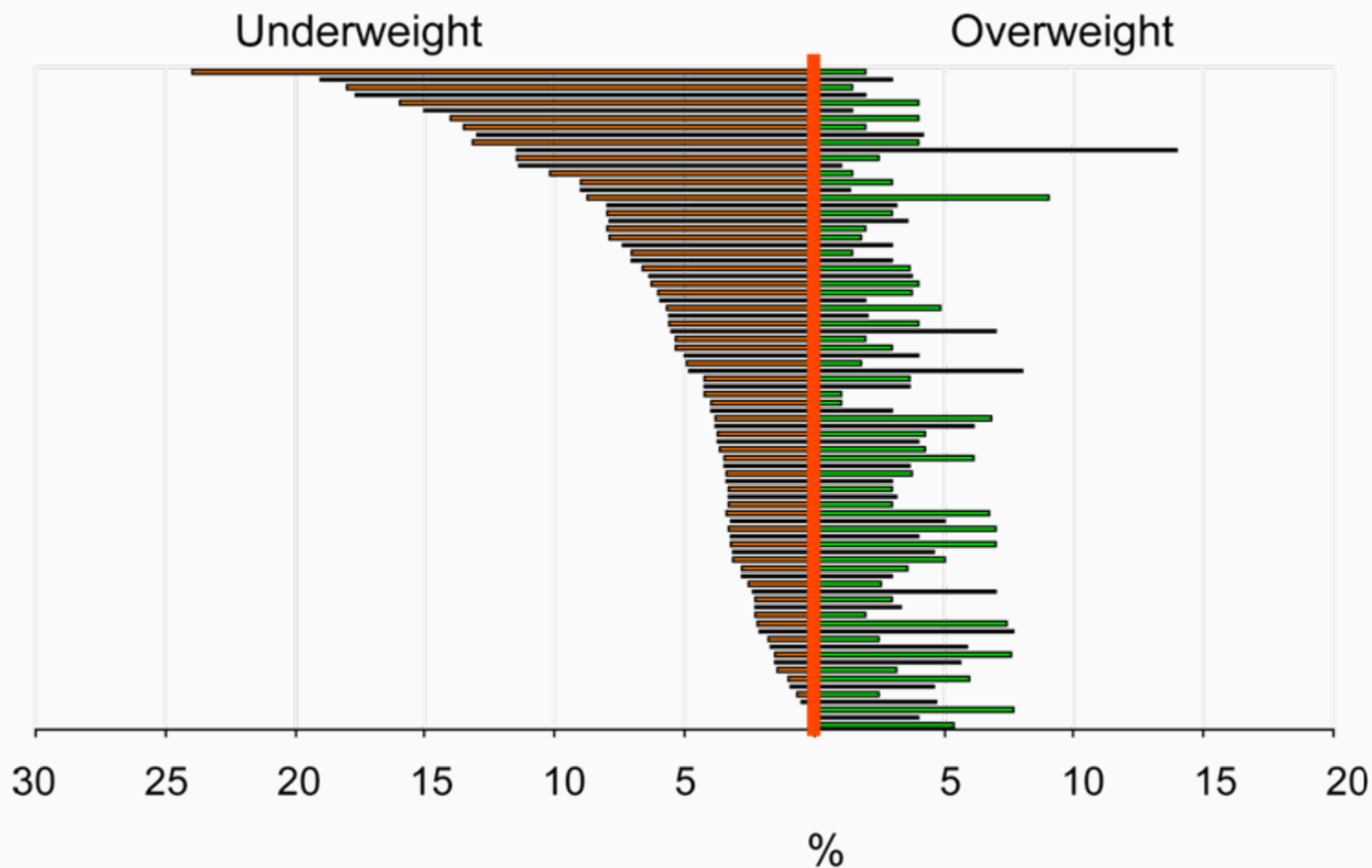


Increase in Obesity Rates in Selected Countries (Women)
