Framework: Tension/Conflict

- Consider which, if any, of the ethical principles/requirements are in tension or in conflict with each other

Framework: Key Facts

- What are the key facts relevant to the ethical/requirements identified in the case?
 - Are there facts missing that would assist in the case analysis?
 - ▶ If yes, what assumptions will you make in order to proceed?
 - Are there contextual issues relevant to the case analysis?
 - ▶ If yes, are these contextual issues relevant to the ethical analysis of this case?

Framework: Options

- What options (or alternatives) are *possible* for how to proceed?
 - Which options are there? Which of these options are the most realistic in this context?
 - What are the pros and cons of adopting each option?
 - What concerns remain regarding the most realistic options?
 - Can any additional actions be taken to further minimize these concerns?
 - How would each of the options address the moral concerns, tensions identified?

Framework: Recommend Option

- Which option would you *recommend*? (Or, what is your assessment of what happened?)
 - Provide the ethical reasoning behind (or ethical justification for) your choice
